Rudolf Plaue

Rudolf O. Plaue, 58, of 20 Moore Lane, Littleton, died at his residence on June 28.

He was born in New York City, N.Y. on May 10, 1939, son of Mrs. Hildegard (Geigenmueller) Plaue of Arden, N.C. and the late Max Plaue. He spent his early life in Hastings-on-Hudson, N.Y. and received a bachelor of arts in government from Cornell University. He was also a graduate of Fordham Law School in New York City.

Mr. Plaue served three years in the U.S. Air Force and was stationed at Hanscom Air Force Base.

He was an attorney for Itek in Bedford, Sanders Corp. of Nashua, N.H., Digital of Maynard, and was general counsel for Nixdorf Siemens of Burlington. Most recently, he was a consultant for many companies including Versys and Alloy Co. and was a professor at Franklin Pierce College Law School.

He had made his home in Littleton for the past 25 years and was an active member of the Littleton Congregational Church, where he was a trustee and on the investment committee. He was also a member of the American Bar Association, NECCA and ACCA.

Besides his mother, Mr. Plaue is survived by his wife Janis (Pellegrino) Plaue of Littleton, a son David C. Plaue of Charlestown, a daughter Michele B. Plaue of Allentown, Pa. and a brother Walter Plaue of Asheville, N.C.
