

## Julienne Whitwell

Julienne B. Whitwell of Littleton died Tuesday, Aug. 19 after a long illness.

Ms. Whitwell was born on June 11, 1948 in Lubbock, Texas, the daughter of O.D. "Whit" and Marjorie Koke Whitwell.

She was educated at Concord Academy and Connecticut College. She was co-owner of the Compass Rose Kennel, specializing in the breeding and care of Newfoundland dogs. She continued her love of animals by caring and finding homes for numerous cats and dogs.

Ms. Whitwell was highly respected in the publishing industry and played a key role in helping her employer become the first publisher in the industry to utilize computerized typesetting. She ultimately became a top-ranked technical support person for major vendors in the publishing and graphic arts industries. From the mid-1980s until her death, she was a lead support person on the International Compuserve Network.

She is survived by her daughter, Jessica H. Tweedy of Lancaster, Pa. and two grandsons, Donald S. Lawrence IV and Joseph Renwick Lawrence of Littleton in addition to her mother, Marjorie Koke Whitwell of Leominster; her father and stepmother, O.D. and Marjan Whitwell of Middlebury, Vt. and a brother, Dwight Whitwell and his wife Nellie of Happy, Texas. She is also survived by her former husband, Renwick Tweedy, his wife Kate and his daughter Eliza, all of Acton. Mrs. Troisi volunteered at the FISH Agency in Sudbury, which provides transportation to townspeople in need. She enjoyed knitting and crocheting, and was especially interested in genealogy.
