TEWKSBURY – Retired Army Maj. Timothy L. O'Keefe, 70, died Monday evening, July 21, at the Blaire House of Tewksbury, after a lengthy

illness. He had been in residence at Blaire House for the past 10 days. He was the husband of Madeline F.

(Mackey) O'Keefe, with whom he had celebrated a 45th-year wedding anniversary on April 26th.



He was born in Somerville Aug. 27, 1926, the son of the late Agnes (Mahoney) and Timothy L. O'Keefe Sr. he was raised in Ayer and Littleton, but had lived the greater part of his life in Tewksbury.

He began his military career in 1944, and served in numerous staff positions during his 22-year enlistment. During WWII, he saw action in the

Philippine Islands, and at the close of the war, served with occupation forces in Germany. He remained on active-duty status at the onset of the Korean War, and served in Hawaii as deputy adjutant general, with his last assignment as adjutant general during the Vietnam War. He was honorably discharged as a major on March 31, 1968.

Among many Army decorations and commendations, he was the recipient of the Combat Infantry Badge, National Defense Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, Bronze Star Medal, Army Commendation Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Army Occupation (Germany) Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Medal, and the Philippine Liberation Ribbon. Since his military retirement, he had remained active in the V.F.W. Portsmouth Chapter, A.A.R.P., and the Reserved Army Officers Association. He was also a communicant of St. William's Church.
